It was a landmark day for New Hampshire students in 1996 when the state legislature passed the first law in the nation to require English language learners to master reading and writing. The law required all public and private schools to provide intensive reading instruction in the fall before the first grade, and it allowed other schools to offer such instruction if they chose, as long as they provided the same learning opportunities. The law also required students to be proficient in reading and writing by the end of third grade. Yet, while we know a great deal about the impact of language arts instruction on student achievement and, indeed, life-long literacy abilities, relatively little is known about the impact of this new state law on student achievement. To help us learn more, the New Hampshire Reading and Writing Project gathered a diverse team of literacy experts to look at five school districts in various stages of implementation of the law.
