I need to make a call to some API that expects the query parameters in the "normal" way, but I need to provide the parameters using named parameters, where the name is the parameter name. For example the query should read: select name from Foo where id = :id Where the normal way to define the parameters in the class would be: select f.name from Foo f where f.id = :id The Java API doesn't support named parameters, however. Is there a way to get JOOQ to accept these named parameters? A: In JOOQ 3.3 and above this is already supported, see the documentation for PostgreSQL. For JOOQ 2.7 and JOOQ 3.2 you can use JOOQ's mix of positional and named parameters, i.e. select * from t where id =?1 or select * from t where id = :id If you want to mix these in, you can use the JOOQ functions concat as a mix, i.e. SELECT * FROM t WHERE id = CONCAT(??) This will come up with parameters in the order specified in the parameterisation. A: The syntax which you describe is supported since version 3.3.0. See re U.S. Gypsum Co

A: If you're not worried about PC use, then you can: download Android version side-load it to your Android phone or Tablet if you don't have one yet For the iPhone/iPad I'd recommend to search the AppStore. But Acrobat could be installed to those devices at some time or other using xCode. As a further recommendation: I think that you don't have to always use the free version of Acrobat Pro.
